What keeps us safe when we are using the Internet?

- Ⓢ If someone sends you an email and you don't know who it is then don't read it.
- Ⓢ Facebook might not be safe if you're linked with someone you don't know.

- Ⓢ Have a code to keep your Internet safe in case someone tries to hack into your computer.
- Ⓢ Never tell anyone your personal information like where you live, your name or your school.
- Ⓢ When I'm on the Internet I usually play games with no chat or optional chat.
- Ⓢ Don't go on illegal sites.
- Ⓢ Don't download random things.
- Ⓢ Don't go on inappropriate websites.
- Ⓢ If anyone is cyber bullying you then you should always tell someone. Never 'suffer in silence'.
- Ⓢ Don't click on any pop ups.
- Ⓢ Don't arrange to meet anyone.
- Ⓢ Tell an adult before you buy anything.
- Ⓢ Don't go on websites you don't know / have been told not to.
- Ⓢ Don't post pictures of yourself online.
- Ⓢ Don't look at something you shouldn't just because your friend told you to.
- Ⓢ Tell your parent before signing up to a website.
- Ⓢ When there are games that you have to pay for, always ask an adult.
- Ⓢ If something is inappropriate on the site that you're using, tell a responsible adult and block the user, you can also report the comment.
