Year One Spring Newsletter

We are delighted to have all of the children back in school and are looking forward to a busy half term! Thank you for all of your support during Lockdown – it is much appreciated.

Our topics for the Spring term will be 'Walking with dinosaurs'

We will be learning about lots of exciting things including:



As writers we will be writing to entertain and inform, including instructions, poems and stories. As mathematicians we will cover White Rose Maths – place value within 50, developing our knowledge of number. As Scientists we will investigating trees. As Historians we will go back in time to learn about Mary Anning (significant individuals in the past) and the amazing discoveries she made. As Artists we will practise our weaving skills and sew pirate flags. As Designers we will learn about cooking and nutrition and will be making a healthy fruit kebab. In Spanish our topics are La granja (farm) and Dinosaurios (dinosaurs). As Atheletes we will develop our Teamwork skills and striking and fielding with Mr Jones. As Philosophers we will learn about Symbols and the Church which we will virtually visit in Rise Park. As Musicians we are going to be continuing our Charanga music scheme with our topics being 'In the Groove' and 'Round and Round'. In our Jigsaw lessons we will be learning about 'Dreams and Goals' and 'Healthy Me'. In Computing we will be following the Purple Mash units 'Lego Builders', 'Maze Explorers' and 'Animated Stories'.

Reading Books

We must continue to stress the importance of reading regularly at home, preferably at least 4 times a week.

Following the first national lockdown, some children have quite large gaps in their reading knowledge which we are working hard to bridge. Please continue to use the comprehension questions with your child which were provided in September, please ask a member of staff if you would like another copy.

Books will continue to be changed on a Monday but need to be in school every day for reading with school staff.

Spelling bookmarks

We hope you feel the current spelling system is more manageable. Previously children have been given 10 spellings to learn and we felt that this was extremely challenging for some children and stressful for some parents.

Our new system of 5 words appears to be working more successfully and the children are enjoying the different Disney characters.

Ultimately our goal is that the children will use this spelling knowledge in their independent writing. If your child is struggling to learn all 5 spelling words, please just focus on one or two to begin with.

Homework

A fantastic well done to everyone who has been reading regularly at home – we already have some children who have very nearly reached 100 on the reading track! We will be rewarding these children very soon!

You will also have noticed that every Friday, the children are bringing home a piece of phonics homework. This is linked to what we have been learning in school and should be used to consolidate the children's knowledge. This homework is to be completed and returned to school. Each class has a tray for the children to put their homework in. Homework is checked every week children who have completed it are rewarded – this may be with stamper, a sticker or a special treat.

Please support your child to complete their homework. Just ask if you need any help.

<u> P.E</u>

P.E remains on **Monday for Ecuador** and on a **Friday for Spain**. Children will need to come to school in their P.E. kits on these days. Please make sure that children **do not wear any jewellery including stud earrings on P.E days**.

Please remember that as the winter months draw in and the weather gets colder, children will still be taking part in P.E outside as long as the weather is dry enough. Please ensure your child has appropriate warm clothing to be outside.
