# What are we learning about this term?

This term we are learning about two themes. First, we are learning all about Heroes and Helpers and reading two stories, A Super Hero like You, and Superworm. After Half Term we will be learning about Nature and changes. Our books will be Jack and the Beanstalk and The very Hungry Caterpillar, one of our favourite stories. #### Illness

## Outdoor Play/Uniform

The outdoor environment is an extremely important part of the Foundation Curriculum and our children will have the opportunity to play outdoors in all weathers. As the weather is now colder, please ensure that your child brings a hat and gloves to Nursery daily. Please check that they are all named. Children also need to wear appropriate footwear, as they will often be running and climbing outdoors exploring their environment. Can we please ask for a pair of named wellies to keep at Nursery. Thank you for your support encouraging all our children to wear uniform. Can we please ask that children wear black school shoes or boots.



Attendance-Several of our children were delighted to receive a medal and certificate from Mrs Kelly our Headteacher at the end of the Autumn Term for 100% attendance. Whilst we appreciate that young children are more prone to catching bugs etc absences can still have a big impact on your child's development. Regular attendance will ensure that children continue to make progress and don't miss valuable learning experiences. Lateness can also affect learning, as your child may miss our carpet session, where we discuss what we are learning about today. The Parrot and Giraffe groups each have an attendance chart and the group receives a golden star when everybody is here.
