The knowledge organisers will be more in depth with vocabulary etc.</p> <p>School staff (teachers and teaching assistants) will be teaching these subjects. However, as written in the policy, outside providers may also come into school. For example, Year 5 take part in the GREAT project, which is an outside provider. This project is designed to promote healthy relationships and domestic abuse awareness and links to curriculum outcomes in RSE/PSHE</p> <p>At Rise Park School, we are committed to building a culture where issues, such as homophobia, are not tolerated, and any occurrences are identified and tackled, in line with our anti-bullying policy. Knowledge organisers for each year group will go into further detail and will be age appropriate. In addition, there will be an opportunity for you to learn about the new guidance for RSHE as well as what will be covered as part of Sex and Relationships education.</p> <p>The content is designed to be taught in specific year groups due to the age and maturity of the children. However, our main aim is to teach in response to the needs of the children. As a result, in some instances, the content may be taught in a different term that year. <b>This will not be the case for Sex Education. This will always be taught in Summer term 2.</b> Rest assured, all content will be covered through the year.</p>
